

## REMOVAL AND TRANSPORTATION OF SNOW

<u>Since the Municipality can push, blow or deposit snow covering a public</u> <u>road or a sidewalk on an adjacent private lot,</u> it is up to the owner of a private lot to take all the necessary precautions, in such a case, to prevent injuries to people or damage to goods and plants.

However, you must know that no obstacle can be installed on purpose in the municipality's right of way, in accordance with the general by-law 2019-03<sup>1</sup> article 14 relating to nuisances.

All owners of private land, on which snow is deposited, pushed or blown, should install snow fences, geotextiles or any other material, sufficiently robust or devices capable of protecting trees, shrubs or other plants, flower beds, post boxes, decorative fences and other decorative elements, to minimize the damage that may be caused by snow deposited, pushed or blown.

Remember that depositing, pushing, placing or throwing snow on public roads or in any public place is *not allowed*!

1. By-law 2019-03 article 14 reads:

**''Layout of snow, ice, leaves of grass or ash** Throwing or laying on sidewalks and streets or in alleys, courtyards, public lands, public places, snow, ice, leaves, grass or ash from private land, constitutes a nuisance and is prohibited"
