RESULTS OF THE BY-ELECTIONS



The Township of Melbourne held a by-election to fill two councillor positions that had become vacant following their departure for personal reasons. Citizens had the option of choosing between advance voting held on November 20th or election day on November 27th.

In order to fill the two seats, we were pleasantly surprised by the number of applications and the interest of young people wanting to get involved in our municipal politics.

We would like to thank the citizens who came out to exercise their right to vote. Out of a possible 928 citizens, only 293 voters cast their ballots, for a participation rate of 31.57%.

PERMITS AND CONSTRUCTION IN 2022





In the first eleven months of 2022, 70 construction, renovation or other permits were issued, for a value of just over 3.2 \$ million.

Investments for all types of construction had jumped by 80% in 2021. The year 2022 was slower for the issuing of permits. People are more informed than before and prefer to postpone their projects given the rise in the price of materials, the increase in the prices of the various trades and the high interest rate.

Whether it is to build, to demolish, to renovate or to install a swimming pool, to dig a well or even to install a septic tank with weeping fields, for all these works and many others, a permit is MANDATORY. All forms are available on the Township's website.
