EMPTYING OF SEPTIC SYSTEM



Notice to citizens who are on the list of septic systems to be emptied in 2022, remember that you will have to prepare the site to facilitate the passage of the truck. Each property to be visited will receive an explanatory letter 15 to 20 days before the week scheduled on the calendar. This service should start around mid-July.
