TREE DAY

The Township of Melbourne will hold its traditional Tree Day on Saturday, May 20th, from 9:00 a.m. until 11:30 a.m. (or until we run out) in the parking lot of the Town Hall at 1257, route 243.

You will have the opportunity to receive trees for FREE! The trees are offered by the Ministère des Forêts, de la Faune et des Parcs through the Association forestière du sud du Québec (AFSQ). We do not know what species we will have in stock.



There will also be compost available for our citizens, so bring your shovel, bins or bags. Please note that in order to give everyone a chance, it will not be possible to fill a trailer.

BIG GARBAGE WEEK - what you need to know:

Residential big garbage collection will be held **during** the week of **May 15th – 19th**, 2023. Be sure to set out your large, heavy, or bulky household items curbside **no later than 7:00 a.m.** on the morning of May 15th. Do not stack objects, leave in a messy way or in a pile.

These collections make it easier to dispose of some large items. However, this should be a last resort as the material is sent to a landfill. Before placing your waste at the curb, make sure that it is not reusable, recyclable or recoverable by reuse organizations such as the Ecocenter.



ALTERNATIVES LIKE THE ECOCENTER

Did you know that the Ecocenter is a place where you can dispose of anything that is recyclable, reusable or recoverable?

In relation to the collection of large items, it is important to evaluate the need to send certain items to landfill sites.

There is an urgent need to reduce the amount of waste we send to landfills. There are several options available to reduce what goes into the garbage bin.

- The blue bin for recycling;
- Home composting;
- The glass recycling bin (at 820 Gouin Richmond);
- The Styrofoam recycling bin (at the municipal garage 1257 route 243, Melbourne).

CAR SHELTERS MUST BE REMOVED

The presence of a temporary car shelter on your property is authorized from November 1st to April 15th of the following year. Outside of this period, the presence of such installations constitutes an offence and is subject to a fine.

These shelters are a temporary alternative and are only permitted during the winter months. They must not be used for storage purposes. You must dismantle and remove all components of the structure. Moving them out of sight is not sufficient.



SEPTIC TANK EMPTYING - 2023

A letter indicating the week of the visit, as well as a description of the preparations to be made, will be mailed to you 15 to 20 days ahead of time. Sites that are not cleared or cannot be found and require a second visit will be charged an additional visit fee.
