Only those addresses that did not have a compliant compost bin during the July 2022 inventory, will receive a black composter. There will be an information session on April 23rd, 2024 at 7 p.m. at the Town Hall community hall. We look forward to seeing you there. The process of implementing organics waste treatment in the Township of Melbourne is nearing completion. Compost collection began on April 1st, with the delivery of brown bins to properties within the extended urban perimeter announced in a previous bulletin.
