








THE NEW MAYOR'S GREETINGS

GARBAGE AND RECYCLING BINS - WHERE - WHEN - HOW?

To make sure that your bins are emptied, please follow these instructions:

- Place your wheeled bin <u>at the edge</u> of the public road, the day before the collection day, or before 7 a.m. of the scheduled morning.
- To facilitate snow removal, please keep your bins off the public road
- Wheels and handles must face the house, otherwise the bin will not be emptied.
- Never place materials on the lid of the bin.
- Leave a distance of 3 feet between any other obstacle (tree, fence, car, etc.).
- Bags, boxes or any items placed on the ground will not be collected.
 If you notice the next day that your bin has been forgotten, please contact us as soon as possible

- The municipal office will be closed for the holidays from December 23rd, to January 2nd, 2026 inclusively.
- **Garbage collection** on Monday, December 29th, and Monday, January 12th, 2026.
- Recycling collection on Wednesday, December 24th, and Wednesday, January 7th, 2026.
- **☀** 2026 first council meeting will take place on Monday, January 12th, at 7:30 p.m.
- January 11th, 2026: deadline for dropping off your undecorated Christmas trees near the municipal garage.

THE END OF OUR PRINTED MUNICIPAL BULLETIN

The main purpose of our newsletters is to communicate important information to citizens. It is our way of being transparent in the transmission of information.

Citizens regularly contact us with questions about topics that have already been covered in our newsletters. We have come to the conclusion that distribution is not reaching the expected results.

We're aware that there's a lot of advertising in our mailboxes, and that much of it, including our newsletters, ends up in the recycling bin. Producing these publications requires time and money which, in the long run, are no longer relevant. We want to reduce our environmental footprint, and the issue of pollution caused by transportation reinforces our decision.

That's why, as of January 2026, we will no longer publish, print and distribute our *Melbourne Township Bulletin* to mailboxes.

In order to keep you informed, we will favour sending newsletter by email, with the exception of publications required by law, such as the mayor's report. We believe this decision will have a positive impact on the environment.

We will continue to publish articles in the « *Journal L'Ardoise* », which is published 4 times a year and distributed by mail to all residences in our municipality.
